15540-16246 is the Netsilik Eskimo collection brought home by Captain Roald Amundsen in November 1906 from the Gjøa-Expedition.

15540. Meat/blubber dish of wood, narrow, rectangular, beautifully formed. Length 30,5 cm., Width 9,4 cm., height 6,5 cm. Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.

15541. Meat/blubber dish of wood, rectangular, carved from a single piece of wood. At one end a semi-circular patch of caribou antler or musk-ox horn is set into the rim as decoration. Length 38,4 cm., width 13,8 cm., height ca. 7,5 cm. Gift from Captain Roald Amundsen. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15542. Rectangular meat/blubber dish of wood, carved from a single piece of wood, fitted with bone pieces at the ends and repaired with horn along the edges. Length 73 cm., width 25,6 cm., height ca. 8,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15543. Round meat/blubber dish of wood, the bottom carved in one piece. The straight top is finished with a thin wooden rim bent into a hoop whose ends are secured with copper rivets. The bottom and rim are held together with the usual (unknown) glue. Diameter 14 cm., height ca. 9,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15544. Round meat/blubber dish of wood, made up of pieces of wood and horn. The thin wooden rim is bent into a hoop and the ends are secured with copper rivets. The bottom and rim are glued together, as are the bottom's separate pieces, and are secured with lashings of caribou sinew. Diameter 17,7-18 cm., height ca. 9,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15545. Round meat/blubber dish of wood, with a slightly rounded bottom made up of two pieces glued together at the middle. The bottom's high rim is finished with a thin wooden rim bent into a hoop, whose ends are secured with copper rivets. A pair of braided sinew handles are fastened to the edge. Diameter ca. 23,5 cm., height 14 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15546. Oval, curved meat/blubber dish of wood; bottom beautifully carved in one piece, sides formed of a thin wooden ring, whose ends are secured with copper rivets and furnished with bone fittings. Diameter, length 47,5 cm., diameter, across 28,5 cm., height ca. 12 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15547. Rectangular meat/blubber dish of wood, originally made of one piece, but cracked and later repaired with lashings of animal sinew and with fittings of brass. Bone fitting at one end, fitting missing at the other end. Length 55,2 cm., width 22,8 cm., height ca. 11 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 10.</anm>

15548. Oblong, four-sided tool box of wood, held together with bone nails. Length 30,5 cm., width 11,5 cm., height 5,7-5,8 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15549. Oval meat/blubber dish of wood, shaped like a deep ladle, with a short handle at one end; the edge of the other end is patched with a piece of caribou antler. Repaired in the museum. Length 33,8 cm., width 15,3 cm., height ca. 10 cm. From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15550. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with the long sides slightly curved outward. Outside each end is a horizontal bar. Length, excluding the bars, 36,2 cm., width 22,5 cm., height 15,5 cm. From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15551. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with the long sides slightly curved outward. Made of several small slabs fastened together with bands of sheet iron. Outside each end is a short horizontal bar. Length 41-43 cm., width 23,5 cm., height 14-15 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15552. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with the long sides slightly curved outward. Made of several slabs, fastened together with bands of sheet metal. Outside each end is a horizontal bar. Length, excluding the bars, 38 cm., width 23 cm., height 13,5-14,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15553. Large cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with the long sides slightly curved outward. The long sides are made of several pieces, fastened together with bands of sheet iron and lashings of caribou sinew. Outside each end is a thin, horizontal bar. Two suspension lines are fastened to the corners. Broken crosswise, but glued together in the museum. Length 72 cm., width ca. 23 cm., height 15,5-16 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15554. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with the long sides slightly curved outward. Outside each end is a horizontal bar. Two suspension lines are fastened to the corners. Mended at one end. Length 61 cm., width 18,7 cm., height 10 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15555. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with sides slightly curved outward; in addition, the

short end sides are bent down from the top. Two suspension lines are fastened to the corners. Outside each end is a thin horizontal bar. Length 30,5-31 cm., width 17 cm., height 12,5-13 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15556. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with sides slightly curved outward. Two suspension lines are fastened to the corners. Outside each end is a thin horizontal bar almost worn away, but repaired in the museum. Length 20,8 cm., width 10,3 cm., height 6-6,2 cm. – Small pots as this one "are used by young girls and younger women for training". From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15557. Cooking pot of soapstone, rectangular, four-sided, with sides slightly curved outward. Broken in pieces, but later restored in the museum. Length ca. 31 cm., width ca. 22 cm., height ca. 11 cm. From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 10.</anm>

15558. Cooking pot of copper sheets, rectangular, four-sided, with the long sides slightly curved outward. Made of several sheets, joined together with copper rivets. The upper corners have holes for suspension lines, but only one line is present. Length 59 cm., width ca. 25 cm., height 13-14 cm. - "The cooking pot is made of old copper from the 'Victory' J. Ross". From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15559. Cooking pot of copper sheets, rectangular, four-sided, with the sides slightly curved outward. Made of several sheets, joined together with copper rivets. Two suspension lines are fastened to the corners. Length 47 cm., width 19,5 cm., height 12,5-13 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15560. Cooking pot of copper and iron sheets, rectangular, four-sided in form. Made of several sheets, joined together with copper rivets. Badly rusted. Length ca. 41 cm., width ca. 22 cm., height ca. 10,5-12 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15561. Cooking pot of copper sheets, rectangular, four-sided in form. Made of several sheets, joined together with copper rivets. Two loops of metal wire, instead of the usual suspension lines, are fastened to the corners. Length 21 cm., width 12 cm., height ca. 6-7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15562. Large lamp of soapstone, long and oval in form; the flat, dish-shaped fat holder is divided in two, one a deeper, wider part in the front along the vertical wall, the other a shallower, raised part in back, divided from the first with a carved stone ridge. Length 98,5 cm., width ca. 17,5 cm., height ca. 8 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15563. Large lamp of soapstone in the usual half-round form. In the center of the flat, dish-shaped fat holder is a shallow depression in the lamp bottom along the wick edge. A piece was broken from the rim, and thereafter glued back in the museum. Length 107,5 cm., width 27 cm., height ca. 7,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15564. Lamp of soapstone, originally formed like no. 15562, with the fat holder divided in two, but here the back section has been removed. One of the angled sides has been repaired with a piece of wood. Length 57,5 cm., width 17-17,5 cm., height 5,5-6 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15565. Large lamp of soapstone in the usual half-round form, with a half-circle-shaped back and a slightly curved front. One side is somewhat damaged, but otherwise the lamp is in good condition. Beautifully made. Length 70 cm., width 37,5 cm., height 7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 10.</anm>

15566. Large lamp of soapstone, almost triangular in form. The flat fat holder with a stone divided in two sections a raised ridge: a narrower front part with a broader section behind it. Length 57,5 cm., width 29 cm., height 4,2-5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15567. Lamp of soapstone, in the usual half-round form, with a relatively high back wall; the angling fat holder slopes evenly down toward the back wall. Length 36,5 cm., width 19,5 cm., height 5,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15568. Lamp of soapstone in the usual half-round form. Length 32,7 cm., width 16 cm., height 5,5-8 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15569. Lamp of stone, in the usual half-round form. The stone is coarse-grained, crystalline (gabbro?). The low, thick back wall is uneven. Carelessly made. Length 42,5 cm., width 23 cm., height 8 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15570. Small lamp of soapstone, in the usual half-round form. Length 15,7 cm., width 10,5 cm., height ca. 4 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15571. Small lamp of soapstone, half-round in form, with a four-sided, carved shelf of stone extending from the inside of the back wall of the fat holder. Apparently never used. Length 15 cm., width 9 cm., height 2,2-2,6 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15572. Small lamp of soapstone. Two holes in the bottom, possibly because the lamp, as many other articles for daily use, has been used as a drill mouth-piece. Length 9,3 cm., width 5,6 cm., height 3-3,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15573. Lamp of stone, oval in form. The stone is coarse-grained, crystalline (gabbro?). Length 16,5 cm., width 9,8 cm., height 4,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15574. Lamp of wood, half-round in form. The flat fat holder is divided in two sections with a ridge; on the front side, a broader part is lined with sheet iron, and a narrower, somewhat higher part lies along the back side. Length 53,3 cm., width 22 cm., height ca. 4,5-5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15575. Drying rack, consisting of a frame of curved caribou prongs bound together, laced with a netting of skin thongs. The form is almost oval. Length ca. 70 cm., diameter ca. 50 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII,

11.</anm>

15576. *Drying rack* consisting of a frame of curved caribou prongs bound together, laced with a netting of animal sinew. The form is almost round. Diameter 73 cm. and 64 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15577. *Drying rack*, half-round in form, consisting of a wooden frame and caribou prongs, laced with a wide-masked net of caribou sinew. Length ca. 90 cm., width ca. 45 cm. From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15578. *Drying rack*, half-round in form, consisting of a wooden frame with a lattice of wooden sticks and caribou sinew. Damaged, but later repaired in the museum. Length ca. 63-64 cm., width ca. 45 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15579. *Drying rack*, consisting of a half-round wooden frame. It has a damaged lattice of wooden sticks and caribou sinew. Length ca. 55 cm., width ca. 32 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15580. *Drying rack*, consisting of a half-round wooden frame. It has a lattice of wooden sticks and caribou sinew. Length 1,07 m., width 65 cm. Repaired in the museum. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15581. *Drying rack*, consisting of a half-round wooden frame. It has a lattice of wooden sticks and caribou sinew. Length 1,06 m., width 66 cm. From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 10.</anm>

15582. *Water bucket*, sewn of depilated sealskin, with a handle of the same material. Height, excluding handle, ca. 27-28 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15583. *Water bucket*, sewn of depilated sealskin, with a handle of the same material. Height, excluding handle, ca. 25-26 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>

15584. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Length 19,7 cm., bottom width 21 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm> N.b. Ladle length is measured from lip of the bowl to tip of the handle.

15585. *Water/fat ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Length 25,4 cm., bottom width 18 cm. – A piece of the rim is missing. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15586. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. The edge is repaired with pieces of horn and sheet iron. Length 23,3 cm., bottom width 20,8 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15587. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. The edge is repaired with pieces of sheet iron. Length 20,2 cm., bottom width 22,2 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15588. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. The edge is repaired with a piece of sheet iron. Length 21,7 cm., bottom width 18 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15589. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. The edge is repaired with pieces of sheet iron. Beautifully made. Length ca. 24 cm., bottom width 19,1 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15590. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. One side is patched. Length 19,7 cm., bottom width 16 cm. From Ogluli. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15591. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Slightly damaged on the edge of one side. Length 19 cm., bottom width 18,8 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15592. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Edges are patched. Length 23 cm., bottom width 19,7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15593. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Beautifully made piece. Length 24,5 cm., bottom width 21,1 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15594. Small *water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Length 13,8 cm., bottom width 13 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15595. Small *water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Length 11,3 cm., bottom width 11,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15596. Small *water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. Length 10,8 cm., bottom width 12,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15597. Small *water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn. The handle is of caribou antler, fastened with animal sinew. Beautifully made. Length 12,2 cm., bottom width 10,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15598. Small *water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn, with a handle of sheet iron. The edge is repaired with sheet iron. Length 11,6 cm., bottom width 11,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15599. *Water/broth ladle*, made of musk-ox horn, with a handle of caribou antler. Length 17,5 cm., bottom width 14,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15600. Broad *spoon* with a short handle, in the same form as the foregoing water/broth ladles. The edge is patched. Length 8,3 cm., bottom width 8,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15601. *Spoon* of musk-ox horn, with an oval bowl and short, bowed handle, like those on the foregoing water/broth ladles. Length 9,9 cm., width 5,7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15602. *Mold* of musk-ox horn, probably for a ladle like the foregoing water/broth ladles. Length 19 cm., width 12,3 cm. Ogluli. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15603. *Water/broth ladle/ice scoop*, with a bowl of musk-ox horn and a long wooden handle. Length 48 cm., bowl width 12,2 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm> N.b. Taylor says 15603-605 are Ice scoops, to scrape snow from the ice. p.100

15604. *Water/broth ladle/ice scoop*, with a bowl of musk-ox horn and a handle of caribou antler. Length ca. 31-32 cm., bowl width 16,2 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

- 15605. Spoon ice scoop**, with flat bowl of musk-ox horn and a wooden handle broken off at the end. Length 20,5 cm., bowl width 6 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15606. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop** of musk-ox horn, with oval bowl and long, pointed handle. A short strap of braided sinew is fastened to the middle of the handle. Length 42,2 cm., bowl width 6,7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15607. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop** of musk-ox horn, with oval bowl and long, pointed handle. A short leather strap is fastened to the middle of the handle. Length 41,2 cm., bowl width 6,7 cm. The edge of one side is repaired with a piece of caribou antler. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15608. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop** of musk-ox horn, with a long, narrow bowl and a slanting cut-off handle. An extension was fastened to the slanting piece, but this is missing. Underneath, the slanting handle is pierced by two holes for attaching the short strap (missing) mentioned in nos. 15606-7. The bowl's edge is repaired. Length 35,3 cm., bowl width 5,4 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15609. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop** of musk-ox horn, with long, narrow bowl. The handle is extended with a firmly-secured piece of caribou antler pointed at the back. Length 48 cm., bowl width 5,9 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15610. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop**, with oval bowl of musk-ox horn. The firmly-secured, two-piece handle is made of musk-ox horn in front and finished with caribou antler; the back piece is wedged into the front. Length 37,8 cm., bowl width 6,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15611. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop**, with oval bowl of musk-ox horn and a firmly-secured handle of caribou antler, pointed at the back. The bowl was broken across, but later sewed together. Length 34,2 cm., bowl width 5,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15612. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop**, with oval bowl of musk-ox horn and a pointed handle of caribou antler. The handle is fastened to the bowl with copper rivets. Length 31,1 cm., bowl width 6,1 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15613. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop**, with long, narrow bowl of musk-ox horn and a broken handle of caribou antler. The handle is fastened to the bowl with copper rivets. A short leather strap is fastened to the handle. Length 26,9 cm., bowl width 4,9 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15614. Water/broth ladle Breathing-hole scoop**, with long, narrow bowl of musk-ox horn and firmly-secured, but carelessly made wooden handle. Length 35,5 cm., bowl width 3,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15615. Bowl** of a water/broth ladle breathing-hole scoop like the foregoing. The handle is missing. Bowl length 15 cm., width 4,7 cm., The edge is somewhat damaged. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15616. Blubber pounder**, made of a musk-ox-horn tip. The narrow end has four finger notches carved into the concave side. Used "for crushing of frozen meat and fat". Length across the curve ca. 21,7 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>
- 15617. Blubber pounder**, made of a musk-ox- horn tip. The narrow end has three finger notches carved into the concave side. Used "for crushing of frozen meat and fat". Length across the curve ca. 22,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>
- 15618. Blubber pounder**, made of seal or whale bone. The head is strongly marked by large blood vessels. Length across the curve ca. 20 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>
- 15619. Blubber pounder**, with head of wood and handle of bone. The handle has four finger notches carved at the bottom. Length ca. 26,5 cm., length of the head ca. 16 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>
- 15620. Blubber pounder** of wood, with a large head and short handle. The head and handle are carved of one piece. Length ca. 26,5 cm. "Used to pound frozen blubber to release oil for the fire dish". From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>
- 15621. Blubber pounder**, with head of wood and a firmly-secured long wooden handle. Length ca. 37 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 11.</anm>
- 15622. Snow beater**, round piece of wood, that decreases evenly in thickness from the middle toward the point and handle. Length 53 cm. Used "to remove snow from clothing". From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15623. Snow beater** of wood, about the same as no. 15622. Length 49,7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15624. Snow beater** of wood, with more flattened form than the foregoing, and with a more distinctly marked handle. Length 43,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15625. Old snow beater** of wood, badly worn at the point and the thin handle. Length 38,8 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15626. Ulu (woman's knife)**, with iron blade, handle of wood, and connecting piece of caribou antler. Length 11 cm., blade width 9,7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15627. Ulu (woman's knife)**, with iron blade, handle of musk-ox horn and three-sided connecting piece of caribou antler. Length 8,5 cm., blade width 9,7 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>
- 15628. Ulu (woman's knife)**, with iron blade, handle of musk-ox horn and three-sided connecting piece of

caribou antler. Length 7,5 cm., blade width 5,6 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15629. Ulu (woman's knife), with blade of sheet iron and connecting piece of caribou antler. The handle is missing. Length 9,1 cm., blade width 8,4 cm. "Found on Tjatâarlu 17/6-1904". King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15630. Small **ulu (woman's knife)**, with iron blade, handle and connecting piece of caribou antler. Length 6,7 cm., blade width 3,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15631. Skin scraper, made of a piece of caribou antler. In one end is wedged a thin blade of sheet iron, curved on the sides. Length 14,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15632. Old **skin scraper** of slate; the surface is unfinished, and at the bottom is a slightly curved, sharpened edge. At the top are two finger notches in the handle. Length 15,8 cm., width over the edge 4,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15633. (Caribou) scapula scraper, the bottom is rounded off at the corners and provided with a blunt edge. Used "to soften skin" or as a "broom", also used "to remove water" when it "accidentally comes on the skins (sleeping skins)". Length 19,3 cm., width 9,3 cm. From Nattilik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15634. (Caribou) scapula, at the bottom it has a blunt edge. Concerning its use see no. 15633. Length 21,5 cm., width 9,6 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15635. (Caribou) scapula, at the bottom it has a blunt edge. Concerning its use see no. 15633. Length 18 cm., width 6,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

15636. A bone of the musk-ox, (**qajaq scraper**) of bone with a hollow blade and a blunt edge. The handle, placed at an angle to the blade, has four finger-notches. A long slot is cut through the handle from the top, in the curve between blade and handle of the scraper. "Used to remove ice off a kayak". Length 24,4 cm. From Ugrulik. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 12.</anm>

16168. Decorative band, made of a thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of small bones sharpened on one end. (Remmene on the outside are decorated with narrow strips of black skin, firmly-sewn according to length *.) The band is closed with a long knob of musk-ox horn. Length ca. 50 cm. 16169. Decorative band, made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of small bones sharpened on one end. Width ca. 1 m. (Ugrulik) King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16170. Decorative band, made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a number of approximately finger-long tubular bones along with two bird feet. Length ca. 112 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16171. Decorative band, made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a number of heads of small animals, with the front teeth remaining in the palates. Length ca. 67 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16172. Decorative band, ("decoration sewn under anorak") made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of front teeth from caribou. Length ca. 60 cm. (Netchilli) King William Land.

16173. Decorative band, made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large eyetooth from a polar bear, and a large molar, as well as a large number of small animal teeth. Length ca. 53 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16174. Decoration consisting of the eyetooth of a polar bear and a small knife of caribou antler, fastened on a short sinew. King William Land. <anm><fie>missing in cupboard 19. 2/7 08 F.B.W.</fie></anm>

16175. Decoration consisting of the eyetooth of a polar bear and a small figure of caribou antler. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16176. Decorative band ("belt") of (untwined/ loose? utvundne) animal sinews, to which are fastened three small knives of caribou antler, one **arrow foreshaft** of caribou antler with an iron point, as well as one **wound peg or sharpened marline spike**, also of caribou antler. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16177. Decorative band, made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a number of small knives of caribou antler, a few small hollow bones, a couple of animal teeth, as well as a few small **models of tools**, such as two **saws**, **a copy of the point on a arctic char fork or, ulu**, all of caribou antler. Width ca. 83 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16178. Decorative band or part of one, consisting of a sinew of sealskin, to which are fastened the eyetooth of a polar bear, half of the jaw of a small predator, together with three larger and two smaller hollow bones. Perhaps this belongs together with no.16181. Length 21 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16179. Decorative band ("belt"), made of a sinew of sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of small hollow bones. The band is closed with a wooden knob. Width ca. 103 cm.(Ugrulik) King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16180. Decorative band, made of a narrow thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of small hollow bones and small bones which are pointed at one end. The band is closed with a knob of caribou antler. Width ca. 90 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16181. Decorative band or part of one, made of a sinew of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of larger and smaller hollow bones. Length ca. 30 cm. Perhaps this belongs together with no. 16178. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16182. Decorative band, made of a thong of depilated sealskin, to which are fastened a large number of small bones, pointed at one end, as well as some long strips of long-haired caribou skin. Width ca. 90 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16183. Round, wooden **hair-stick**, tapered toward the upper end. A leather band with an outwardly curved edge is bound at the bottom. Length 36,9 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19. <fie> Nos.16183-84. The pins are to extend to an Inuk women's braids, especially on festive occasions. 16184. Round wooden *hair-stick* similar to no. 16183, tapered toward the upper end. A leather band with an outwardly curved edge is bound at the bottom. 16185. Model of a snow shovel, made of wood: the handle is of sheet iron. **A toy.** Length 28,3 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16186. Model of a dog sled, with runners of wood and crossbars (3) of caribou antler. Length ca. 26,5 cm. **A toy.** King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16187. Top with a flat, round disc of caribou antler. The peg is of wood. The disc's largest diameter 4,2 cm. **A toy.** King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16188. Top with a round (<ost>top</ost>?) disc of caribou antler, slightly arched on one side and flat on the other side. The peg is of wood. The disc's largest diameter 4 cm. **A toy.** King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16189. Top with a round disk of musk-ox horn, slightly arched on one side and flat on the other side. The peg is of wood. The disc's largest diameter 4,3 cm. **A toy.** King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16190. Ring and pin game, consisting of a 9 cm. long piece of wood, pointed at one end, broad and oval at the other. Rows of holes are bored in the broad end, and a pointed pin, made of caribou antler and bound to the wooden piece, fits into these holes., **A toy.** King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16191. Bilboquet/ Ring and pin game, made of the joint-end of a thick, tubular bone, with holes bored in the broadest end. A pointed, bone pin, bound to the piece, fits into these holes. Length 8,9 cm. **A toy** (Nattilik) King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>

16200. Model of a bow case with bow and arrow. The case is of fish skin with a wooden handle. The bow is beautifully made of caribou antler, with 'hitched' lashings and bow string of animal sinew. The arrows, 6 in number, are collected in a bundle with a hood of fish skin; all have wooden shafts and horn points. The case's length 38-39 cm., the bow's length 39,6 cm. - 16215. Qajaq model**, covered with thin, depilated caribou skin, with the small, double-bladed paddle belonging to it. The qajaq's length 1,24 m., the paddle's length 65,9 cm. (Nattilik) King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>
- 16216. Qajaq model**, covered with thin, depilated sealskin(?). Length 80,5 cm. King William Land. <anm>VIII, 19.</anm>
- 16217. Shaman's a'nuraaq** of caribou skin, with the hair side turned in; it is edged at the bottom with white skin and hung with fringes of depilated skin. On the chest are fastened five, free-hanging weasel skins, together with a short string of beads fastened with a **safety pin**; On the back there is also a weasel skin and a band of caribou skin with long fringes; also there is an amulet band hung with different, small things: some **knife models** of caribou antler, an **iron** needle, a knob and some glass beads. - 16220.** Large **shaman's drum**, consisting of a solid wooden ring, over which is stretched thin depilated skin; the skin is patched in many places with bladder skin. - 16236. a.** Spindle-shaped **tool** of caribou antler; two holes have been bored in the middle, at right angles to each other. - 16237. Bow**, made of one piece of wood, oval in cross-section. The ends are covered with sheet iron. The back is lashed with twined animal sinew. Length 1,8 m. King William Land? <anm>VIII, 18.</anm>
- 16238. Bow**, made of one piece of wood. The middle section is broad and flat; the end sections taper evenly in width to the end. A narrow groove runs along the middle of one of the broad sides. The back has clearly had lashings, but they have been removed. Length 1,25 m. Victoria Land? <anm>VIII, 18.</anm>
- 16239. Bow**, made of one piece of wood, flat and broad across. The middle section is somewhat thicker and more narrow than the adjoining sections, which again taper off evenly toward each end. The back is covered by a strip of depilated sealskin, over which 'hitches' of animal sinew are placed. The bow string was probably made on "Gjøa". Length 150,5 cm. Victoria Land. <anm>VIII, 18.</anm>
- 16240.** Bundle of arrows (in a **case** of blue cloth) consisting of 7 **arrows** for bird hunting, with blunt points. The shafts are of wood and red-colored. Be<unclear> three-part feathering. Length 72,7-76,8 cm. Alaska? <anm>VIII, 5.</anm>
- 16241. Man's a'nuraaq** of short-haired caribou skin. Cut straight at the bottom and, like the cuffs and hood opening, edged with fine, long-haired skin. Above the bottom edge is sewn in a border of white and brown skin in a distinctive zigzag pattern, finished at the bottom with a narrow strip of depilated, red-colored skin. The hood's sides are lengthened down over the chest with two attached three-sided flaps, also of white skin. Length (from the hood's point to the bottom of the back) ca. 1,1 m. Herschel Island. <anm>VIII, 5.</anm>
- 16242.** Pair of high-legged **man's boots**, with soles of white, tanned sealskin, with uppers of caribou leg-skin. The high legs are sewn of white and brown caribou skin, and the upper edge is also of white skin, with rows of dotted lines of red wool thread sewn in. The edge itself is of depilated, red-colored skin. There is a leather instep band at the bottom, a drawstring of animal sinew at the top. Height ca. 47 cm. Herschel Island. <anm>VIII, 5.</anm>
- 16243.** Pair of **finger mittens** of depilated caribou skin, with edging of white, short-clipped caribou skin and also a fine, grey skin (otter or marten?). Rows of dotted lines of blue wool yarn are sewn on the white edge. The mittens originally had a beautiful red color, but have been blackened in the museum by air pollution. Herschel Island. <anm>VIII, 5.</anm>
- 16244. Stick game (cribbage board)**, made of a beautifully polished walrus tooth; on its upper side are seen many rows of holes, along which the game sticks are moved. The sticks (4), also of ivory, are stored in a small hollow in the broad end of the tooth, which is closed with a rotating cover. The tooth's exterior is covered with incised and colored drawings of modern houses, ships, etc. Length 43 cm. Alaska. <anm>VIII, 5.</anm>
- 16245. Swinging board** of wood, pointed blade-shaped, with a sawtooth edge. Length 23,7 cm. Alaska. <anm>VIII, 5.</anm>
- 16246.** Curved **pipe stem** (not bored through) of ivory, with a thin, detached jagged edge: interrupted work. The upper side is flat and without ornamentation; the under side is slightly arched and has securely carved, black line and dot ornaments. Beautiful work. Length 33,1 cm. Aleutian Islands. <anm>VIII, 5.
